- 1. Why are you seeking the position of Judge of the Common Pleas Court? I am seeking the position of Judge of the Court of Common Please because I would like to put my 30 + years of legal training and experience to work for the citizens of Erie County. I recognize the tremendous responsibility involved with the position, and believe that I have the qualifications necessary to be a fair, compassionate, and decisive judge.
- 2. Being careful to maintain client confidentiality as embodied in the Rules 1.6 of the Rules of Professional Conduct, describe the general character of your law practice, including areas of concentration and the most significant achievements of your legal career. Explain how your practice has prepared you for the position of Judge of the Court of Common Pleas. I would describe my practice as very broad based. I have handled cases from A-Z and just about everything in between. I have tried homicide cases, civil cases, probate cases, misdemeanor and felony cases, as well as domestic cases.

Areas of concentration over the course of my career include criminal, family law, real estate, estates and mental health law.

I am proud of that fact that I brought Collaborative Law to Erie County. After I was trained in 2007, I am happy to say that our local group now has more than 40 members trained to help people resolve their issues in a more respectful manner.

I also take great pride in the fact that I have presided over 5,500 mental health hearings since 1991, with no decisions appealed!

Experience in virtually every area of the law has prepared me for the position of Judge on the Court of Common Pleas.

I have been a member of the Erie County Bar Association since 1986, and have been a member of the family law, real estate, scholarship, estates and trust, Stepping Out and fee dispute committees. I have also served as a legal aid volunteer attorney.
